
# Nancy Lessner Legislative Committee Chair 972-800-0647

**Legislative Update** - A summary of the 89<sup>th</sup> session is below with concerns for your future.

The 89th Texas Legislative Session has ended, leaving many retirees hoping for further benefit enhancements. The Texas Retired Teachers Association (TRTA) had expected a difficult session, with a focus on education savings accounts (vouchers) rather than retiree benefits. Although **TRTA worked hard to protect and improve benefits, the session didn't result in additional funding for retirees**. This year's focus shifted primarily to active education issues, such as school vouchers. The TRTA advocated for full funding of the Teacher Retirement System (TRS) pension and health insurance plans, urging the state to use budget surpluses to reduce unfunded liabilities. **However, no significant benefit enhancements or reductions in TRS liabilities were made.** 

While the state budget included full funding for TRS contributions, the passing of HB 2, a major education reform bill, and SB 3, concerning school vouchers, **negatively impacted the TRS**, extending its projected funding period by eight years and pushing the system out of actuarial soundness.

This delay means retirees cannot receive cost-of-living increases until the system returns to actuarial soundness (under 31 years).

## ECHO August 2025 - Constant Contact, registering for meetings

Out first communications will go out on July 30th as a reminder of the August 1st invitation. Here are some tips to ensure you will receive your emails:

If you are receiving your invitations on an iphone or ipad, make sure you have your mail setting on "list" and not "category."

To check your setting in your mail app, click on the three dots at the top right of the screen. Make sure the "list" is selected. All the emails will be in one list and not sorted separately. If Apple does an upgrade in it's operating system, it may reset this to "categories"; check to make sure it is still on "list."


If you are using webmail with g-mail, make sure you have it set on "all". G-mail also sorts into categories. Go into your setting or check several folders like "social" or "promotions" to find the Constant Contact emails.

If you have a new email address, do not just enter it into Constant Contact when you register. This action will not guarantee you receive your invitation at the new address.






#### Rady to Inspire? Become a Study Buddy Today!
